

Roasted Vegetable Salad

Chef Lee Gustin, FSC Supervisor Prep Time: 5 minutes Cook Time: 15 minutes Total Time: 20 minutes Course: Side Dish Servings: 4

Ingredients

8 oz. asparagus 4 oz. cherry tomatoes 4 oz. feta cheese 1 squash 1 zucchini 1 head romaine lettuce 1 clove garlic 1 tbsp. olive oil 2 oz. balsamic vinegar 1 tsp. honey 6 oz. olive oil Salt and pepper to taste

Equipment

Sheet pan Large mixing bowl Small mixing bowl

Prep

Rough cut all vegetables Chop romaine lettuce Mince garlic

Directions

Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (convection).

In large mixing bowl, add vegetables with 1 oz. of olive oil. Spread onto sheet pan. Lightly salt and pepper and roast for 20 minutes then remove from oven and chill.

In a small bowl, mix 2 oz. balsamic vinegar and one tbsp. of honey. Add 6 oz. of olive oil and mix slowly.

In large bowl, combine the chopped romaine lettuce and vegetables. Drizzle with the balsamic dressing mix and serve with crumbled feta on top.


